THE FLAME CONFERENCE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

The Flame Conference is an event for young people of school yr 10 and upwards to help them share their faith and grow in it with other young people across the UK. It is being held in Wembley Arena on **Saturday 24th March 2012 from 10.00am to 6.00pm** and is building on the youth events around Pope Benedict's visit last year at the same time as linking to the forthcoming Olympics. The day will consist of music, drama, prayer and witness statements and speakers will include Archbishop Vincent Nicholls, Fr. Timothy Radcliffe OP and Fr. Christopher Jamieson OSB. The Parish of Truro are organising a coach which will leave Truro at 2am and it is hoped will arrive back in Truro at 2am the following morning! They are inviting young people from our Parish to join them on this 'expedition'. The total cost of the day will be around £50.00. It is proposed that young people from our parish will have half of that amount paid out of parish funds and that a further discretionary concession will be made for anyone who has difficulty in paying £25.00.
