### YEAR OF FAITH

Pope Benedict XVI has set aside a special year for Catholics throughout the world to rediscover, and share with others, the precious gift of Faith entrusted to the Church and the personal gift of faith that we have each received from God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. The Holy Father has decreed that the Catholic Church will observe the Year of Faith between 11th October 2012 and 24th November 2013 (The Feast of Christ the King). He has chosen to open the Year of Faith on 11th October because that date is the anniversary of two important events in the life of the Catholic Church: the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council (11th October 1962 - 8th December 1965) and the 20th anniversary of the publication of the Catechism of the Catholic Church by Blessed John Paul II. The Year of Faith is an invitation to everyone in the Church to celebrate and renew their faith. Pope Benedict has outlined the purpose of the Year of Faith as: "to give fresh impetus to the mission of the whole Church to lead human beings out of the wilderness in which they often find themselves to the place of life, friendship with Christ that gives us life in fullness."
