The project in Beira - helping the villagers to create an adequate & sustainable water supply - has been successfully completed and Cafod is now CONNECTING to SEBEYA. Sebaya is a small village in the dry, arid north of Ethiopia, badly scarred by the war with Eritrea. Shortage of food is the greatest challenge as it doesn't rain enough to grow crops so the needs of this small, largely Catholic community are immense. A new display is being set up on the CAFOD notice board in the narthex to introduce this new project - please try to spare a few minutes to have a look.
