QUIET DAY, TRURO CATHEDRAL, Friday 18th October

At the Bishop of Truro's invitation, the present Abbot of Landevennec is leading a Quiet Day in Truro Cathedral. Landevennec in Brittany has been a place of pilgrimage for ecumenical groups over many years. It is the burial place of St. Guernole who was active both in France and in Cornwall (in Cornwall the saint is known as Winwallow, Gunwallow or Guenole). During the day Abbot Jean-Michael will lead two reflections on the Benedictine Rule and Way of Life and there will be space for personal reflection and prayer. The day commences with coffee in the Cathedral at 10.00am. There will be a Eucharistic celebration at 12.15pm followed by a simple pasty lunch. The day ends with prayer at 3.30pm. If you wish to attend the Quiet Day, it is necessary to let the Bishop's Office know by 14th October, either by post to: The Bishop's Office, Lis Escop, Truro, Cornwall, TR3 6QQ, or by email: office@truro.anglican.org. Also you need to indicate if you wish a pasty, and whether meat or vegetarian.
