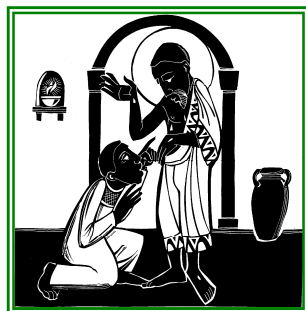

This 25th anniversary is an occasion for the parish to celebrate and a number of events have been arranged: on the evening of *5th May at 7.00pm* Bishop Mark has kindly agreed to visit the parish and celebrate Mass for us; on *Saturday 20th June* St. Mewan Sinfonia, Cornwall's only String orchestra, will be giving a concert in the church; and from *Thursday 24th September* to *Sunday 27th September* there will be a flower festival in the church, with a concert being given by the Mevagissey Male Choir on *Saturday 26th September*. Although this year celebrates the opening of the church building, let us pray that as the people of the parish we may continue to use our church for the worthy worship of God in order to be effective witnesses to our faith in the world.
