FAIRTRADE

'Fairtrade' is a global organisation with a strong and active presence in the UK. It works to ensure that farmers and workers throughout the world get a fair price for their produce and decent working conditions. It supports small scale farmers and workers who are marginalised from trade in a variety of ways. We can support this vital work by making an active decision to buy fairtrade goods whenever possible. The major supermarkets are all committed to stocking a certain percentage of fairtraded produce and staple items such as tea, coffee and sugar. St Augustine's has been proud to have been a 'Fairtrade Parish' for a number of years and indeed was the first parish in the Catholic Deanery of Cornwall to be granted Fairtrade status. This means that the items that are purchased for refreshments, coffee, tea, sugar etc all bear the 'Fairtrade' logo. On occasions parishioners very kindly donate items such as tea/coffee etc. and this is much appreciated. However, in order to maintain the parish's fairtrade status, it would be very helpful if donated items are 'fairtrade' goods.

DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO CREDITON

Sunday 5th June: Solemnity of St. Boniface

Pope Francis has stressed that pilgrimage has a special place in this Holy Year of Mercy. During the year, we have various opportunities to take this up, including a special Diocesan Pilgrimage to Crediton, the birthplace of Saint Boniface. Sung Vespers and Solemn Benediction will be celebrated at St. Boniface Church at 4.00pm, followed by a Solemn Procession to the statue of St. Boniface. After prayers at the statue there will be a final blessing by Bishop Mark, returning to St Boniface Church for afternoon tea. The town is also celebrating with a Flower Festival at Holy Cross Church, a St Boniface Walk commencing at 2pm and a re-enactment of the story of St Boniface below the statue in Newcombes Meadow at 3pm.
